BURLINGTON, Mass.--(BUSINESS WIRE)--Sep. 4, 2018-- Everbridge and the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children® (NCMEC) celebrate the ongoing success of their alliance that has helped to reunite missing children with their families over the past four years. Since launching the venture in 2014, NCMEC has provided support to law enforcement in hundreds of cases nationwide—cases which were brought to the organization's attention with Everbridge's help.

Everbridge, Inc. (NASDAQ: EVBG), the global leader in critical event management software designed to help keep people safe and businesses running, enables police and sheriff's departments, among others, to send alerts to their residents through a secure network. Those alerts are monitored by NCMEC for cases involving missing or exploited children. When a relevant match is found, NCMEC reaches out to law enforcement to offer its vast resources and support. In the past year alone, over 700 incidents have been sent to them through the Everbridge network.

"The use of technology to provide alerts about a missing child is an invaluable timesaver, especially given the need to act quickly in these cases," said John Bischoff, NCMEC Executive Director, Missing Children Division. "Everbridge products play an instrumental role in that alerting process, which is key to finding missing children and bringing them home safely."

Everbridge's network of municipal, county, and state police departments helps those organizations collaborate locally and, in the case of NCMEC, nationally. At a time when public safety budgets and staff continue to be stretched, interagency cooperation and teamwork is essential to keeping people safe.

In the recent case of a young girl who went missing last year from her home in Georgia, NCMEC received an Everbridge alert from local law enforcement, provided the girl's family with emotional support, and sent someone with search team expertise to provide on-site assistance to law enforcement. After a day of searching, she was located alive in a wooded area, transported to a local hospital for evaluation, and brought home safely.

"Everbridge is in the business of safety," explains Everbridge CEO Jamie Ellertson. "It is an honor any time we can help agencies work together to safeguard our communities. We are proud to continue our work with the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children to help protect our most valuable asset, our children."
